Step 1

Paint the jug in two coats of green paint and let dry. While drying, assemble the body, hair, and cape.

Step 3

Take the black tablecloth, cut about a 20" piece off, and cut into 1" strips, leaving about 4"on one end to secure to the witch's hat.

Step 6

Place the tomato cage upside down and place the assembled parts above on top of it.

Step 8

Please exercise caution when handling the glue gun, as it can become very hot. When crafting with children, ensure that an adult is present to supervise and operate the glue gun.

Step 4

Once the base layers of the jug have dried, you can add the details! Add a witch face to the jug using the white and black acrylic paint. Let completely dry.

Step 7

With the remaining tablecloth, drape each side over the arms and tape or glue it onto the hanger to secure it. Slightly pull the tablecloth up and glue it to the opening of the jug to cover the open space.
